

# AN ACT OF OBEDIENCE

Aidan Cruz is a dedicated college sophomore who throws himself wholeheartedly into everything he cares about including academics, sports, and his walk with Jesus.

This Easter, he found himself wrestling deeply with a call from God, seeking clarity and direction as he approached the weekend. The journey began with a reflective Good Friday service, perfectly matching Aidan's introspective state of mind. For over a year and a half, he had been diligently working toward a significant goal. But just days before showcasing his hard work, he felt God urging him to let it go.

"In the days leading up to Easter, I spent time praying, reading Scripture, and fasting, trying to discern what God was asking of me," Aidan shared. "Even though I knew the answer, I struggled with obedience and continued pursuing my own path, which left me feeling broken."

During the Good Friday service, Aidan was reminded of God's unshakeable love—a love that isn't dependent on any decisions he makes. This reassurance stirred something in him as he continued to wrestle with the choice ahead.

Then came Easter Sunday, and with it, a renewed call to obedience. Aidan felt prompted to publicly proclaim his faith through baptism, a step he had not yet taken in his five years of following Christ. Embracing this act of faith became the most significant step of obedience he had ever made, filling him with peace and assurance.

"This act of faith and obedience led to one of the most pivotal and special moments in my spiritual journey—an Easter baptism," Aidan reflected.

The impact of Aidan's decision rippled through his family, inspiring his younger brother, Liam, to also take the step of baptism.

"I'm grateful to have experienced such a powerful Easter weekend at Hill Country," Aidan said. "It deepened my understanding of just how profoundly God loves me and each of us."

Karen Cruickshanks, a single mom to fiveyear-old triplets, truly understands the saying, "It takes a village" to navigate life. Her village includes volunteers from Hill Country Children's Ministry, with Meredith Taylor being one of those volunteers.

Meredith has been a part of the Hill Country church family since 2017 and has served in Children's Ministry for close to two years. Karen has attended Hill Country since she was young, but their paths didn't cross until last fall in Children's Ministry when Karen shared that just that week her son, Charlie, had experienced a life-threatening reaction to his epilepsy treatment.

As a single parent, Karen was overwhelmed and stressed, having to balance caring for one critically ill child in the hospital and her other two children, Lucy and James. During this difficult situation, several of the children's Sunday school teachers did something extraordinary—they showed up.

They arrived at the hospital with Charlie's favorite pasta, a special request after being on a liquid diet for days. Their kindness didn't stop there; they also went to Karen's house to help keep things

running—from childcare to household chores—truly embodying the hands and feet of Jesus.

This summer, Karen and her children continued to feel grateful for Hill Country and the Children's Ministry. A few weeks ago, Lucy came home from Sunday school with a beaming smile, telling her mom how much she loves Jesus and wants to go to heaven. The next week, she was excited to participate in the Great Adventure's BackYard Bible Club, where Meredith's daughter was one of her teachers.

Being a part of the Children's Ministry has made a world of difference for Karen's family. "Due to Charlie's complex medical needs, I'd been attending church sporadically for a while," Karen said. "But my experience last fall gave me the reassurance I needed—Children's Ministry is fully equipped to support Charlie."

While her children learn about Jesus in a safe, engaging environment, Karen can attend a Single Parenting class where she's found an authentic, supportive community. Karen's journey with the Children's Ministry is a beautiful reminder that we're not meant to go through life alone.

Meredith is honored to walk alongside Karen and her family, in part because of Karen's willingness to graciously receive the help. "Seeing Karen humble herself has been both a blessing and lesson to me," Meredith shared. "I've enjoyed walking alongside someone so willing to receive the help of others—it's been a good lesson in being a gracious receiver."

One of Terri's favorite moments each Sunday is watching the kids worship. "Their love for the Lord is so pure and genuine it's brought me to tears," she said. "It's deepened my own relationship with Him in ways I never expected."

Terri credits the Special Needs Ministry with helping her climb out of a tough place. "I'm still a work-in-progress, but serving has grown my faith, shifted my outlook, and reminded me that God has a plan for me," she reflected. "He's definitely not done with me yet."

## A PLACE TO **BELONG & THRIVE**

The Special Needs Ministry has been a game-changer for Brad and Anya Hopp and their daughter, Vika.

"Vika absolutely loves coming to church because of this incredible ministry," Brad shared. "She'd live at the church if she could! She's embraced by the amazing staff and volunteers, and she's found a circle of sweet friends who make her feel at home."

Grateful for the impact on their own lives. Brad and Anya are passionate about sharing this community with others. They jump at every opportunity to invite families with special needs to Hill Country, knowing firsthand the difference it can make.

Anya did just that when she met Kevin James at an adaptive cooking class attended by Vika and Kevin's son, Isaac. Through their conversations, Anya discovered that Kevin's family had been unable to attend church for a long time because their previous church lacked accommodations for Isaac.

"It was clear that they were hurting and deeply longing to be a part of a community with other Christ-followers," Anya recalled.

After inviting them to Hill Country, the James family has now been attending regularly for the past year. "Like us, they've found a spiritual family that truly understands what it means to walk with Jesus and to make Him known through the unique gifts of our special children," Anya added.

The special needs community at Hill Country is profoundly supportive, offering resources, prayers, and a sense of camaraderie to families on this challenging journey. God's heart for the forgotten and marginalized shines brightly here.





# ATHEIST TURNED HILL COUNTRY MEMBER

Nicole grew up in a Christian household but became disillusioned with Christians and the faith at a young age. For two decades, she identified as an atheist, completely turning away from her beliefs.

Last December, Nicole's journey took an unexpected turn when an online personality challenged her to explore a "divine spark." Intrigued but unsure of what that meant, Nicole began exploring various faiths, but none resonated with her. "I didn't immediately decide to return to Christianity," Nicole recalled. "I explored other religions, but they either didn't make sense or felt too complicated."

One day, while out for a walk, Nicole realized that Hill Country Bible Church's Lakeline location was nearby. On a whim, she decided to attend a service, purely out of curiosity and without any expectations.

"To my surprise, I was greeted with such warmth," Nicole shared. "A Welcome Center host introduced me to some Young Adult Ministry leaders who took the time to engage with me and answer my questions about faith. Their kindness and patience encouraged me to return the following Sunday, where I found myself asking even more questions."

Within weeks, Nicole connected with Paul and Kathy Barger, who helped her dive deeper into Christianity, addressing her doubts and guiding her spiritual journey. A few months later, Nicole made the life-changing decision to place her complete faith and trust in Jesus, celebrating her commitment through baptism.

Hill Country Bible Church soon became Nicole's church home. She completed the Discover Hill Country class, where she learned more about the church, found ways to connect, and discovered how she could use her gifts to serve others.

This journey led Nicole to the Special Needs Ministry, where her interactions with children have been profoundly impactful. Serving in this ministry not only gave her a renewed sense of purpose but also inspired a new direction for her life and career—she now wants to work with children.

"It's incredible that something I once thought wasn't for me turned out to be the best decision I've ever made," Nicole reflected.

Logan has been attending Hill Country since 2019. "Though I grew up in a Christian home, it wasn't until college that I took ownership of my faith, actively growing in my relationship with Jesus," Logan said.

Nick's story is similar, but with a twist. "I was raised in a Christian home like Logan, but I drifted away from my faith during college," Nick said. "It took a series of tough life challenges nearly four years ago for me to surrender my life to God and experience a renewed faith."

Logan and Nick crossed paths in a Hill Country Young Adult Small Group, which they eventually co-led. With guidance from mentors like Roger Ingram and Kurt Ritz, they not only grew spiritually but also sharpened their leadership skills. Eventually, they started leading their own small groups, pouring into others just like Roger and Kurt poured into them.

With over 25 years in the golf industry, Scott does more than just oversee the lush fairways of the club. He has nurtured a space where faith and work intersect gracefully.

"Through my own spiritual journey and commitment to Christian values, I noticed a spiritual void within the workplace and saw an opportunity for fellowship and growth," Scott said. Despite the club's initial reluctance to allow faith-based gatherings on its premises, the group's persistent prayer and advocacy eventually led to permission to meet on site. This early challenge demonstrated the group's steadfastness and reliance on God to work out His purpose.

Since its inception, the faith group at Great Hills has become a place for spiritual growth for

life, and support one another through fellowship," Scott explained. Members meet weekly, engaging in Bible studies and discussions that apply biblical principles to daily life. "Most recently, the group has decided to pray and recommend a portion of initiation fees to be allocated toward local ministries, reflecting our commitment to make a tangible impact in the community," Scott

The presence of the faith group has gained attention from fellow members and staff inquiring about the meetings. Some have asked if they can be a part of it and some of the staff notice amidst the busyness that Scott has emphasized "what is important over what is urgent." The group's activities have also provided spiritual support and been a conduit for hope and transformation within the workplace. Scott recalls a particularly moving instance where a conversation about his faith and the group helped a colleague to embrace their own faith, showcasing the profound influence of these gatherings.

As Scott reflects on his tenure, he considers not just the legacy of beautiful golf courses he's maintained but more so the community he's helped build. His efforts at Great Hills Country Club show that faith can thrive in any setting, bringing individuals together in meaningful ways, and leaving a lasting impact on everyone involved.

Eventually, he was the first person to be baptized in the church, which was a beautiful celebration. Arm frequently says: "I've never seen this man [Jesus], but I love Him."

**Training Tomorrow's Leaders** 

In 2023, Hill Country began a vital partnership with Training Tomorrow's Leaders, an organization dedicated to equipping church planters among predominantly Islamic and Animistic communities in Northern Ghana, Togo, and Burkina Faso. Their mission is to transform West Africa into the image of Christ, sharing the gospel through both words and actions.

To support this vision, Hill Country raised \$20,000 last year to dig four water wells in villages where clean water was a scarce and precious resource. These wells have done more than provide fresh water—they have become a gateway for local church planters to serve their communities in a deeper way. By providing clean water, they have the opportunity to share about Jesus—the true living water.




